It was in mid 80's that Syed Ihsan Ullah Waqas and Mr. Liaqat Baloch, the founder members of the Makkah Foundation and eminent social workers, realized the need for setting up a superior quality school that could provide quality education to the children of indigent and lower middle class at an affordable expense. A piece of land measuring 66 kanals, in a comparatively underdeveloped area of Southern Lahore, was purchased in 1989, by the Foundation from the Department of Housing & Physical Planning, Government of the Punjab. The ground-breaking ceremony of the Foundation's first educational venture, the Township Campus, was held on 14th August 1990. This School took a modest start with Preschool, Junior & Girls High School in April 1992 and Boys High School in April 1994 in three blocks of single-storey buildings. During the period of nine years, after its inception, some more philanthropists and social workers joined hands towards promoting this cause that enabled us to add a separate block of Junior School, another storey of Preschool, and two floors each of Boys and Girls Schools in addition to constructing multipurpose hall and a swimming pool.

By 2001, the School had become one of the leading Schools of Lahore. Encouraged by this success, the Foundation extended the educational facilities to Kot Khawaja Saeed, another educationally backward area of Northern Lahore. School followed school in quick succession; the third school of the chain, established in Johar Town, went functional in 2007. The fourth school of the chain, another state-of-the-art campus spreading over an area of 52 kanals at Khayaban-e-Jinnah went operative in 2013. The fifth school, WAPDA Town Campus spreading over 27 Kanals will be functional from March, 2022.

Our students have produced commendable results in the matriculation examination during the past years. Detail of positions obtained in Lahore Board Exams is as under:

The Punjab School

LAKE CITY, RAIWIND ROAD CAMPUS

This campus is spread over 16 Kanals on Jia Bagga Road, off Main Raiwind Road, Lahore. It is a state of the art, purpose-built campus, having total capacity of 3,000 students with six sections of each class. Overall covered area of the school is 120,000 square feet.

Pre-school Section consists of classes for playgroup, nursery, prep and class-I for both boys and girls. Junior School Section starts from class two to five for both boys and girls. There are separate buildings for girls and boys from Class VI to Class X.

The administration block has been constructed to have Administration and Medical staff.



Township Campus

This campus is sprawled over 66 kanals, and consists of four academic blocks; the Preschool, Junior School, Girls High School and Boys High School, having a covered area of 260,518 square feet. The Preschool takes care of Nursery, Prep & Class I. Classes from II to IV girls and II to V boys are housed in the Junior School. The girls from Classes V to X and the boys from Classes VI to X are accommodated in their respective high schools. This is a twelve - section school with a capacity to accommodate 5,300 students.



Kot Khawaja Saeed Campus

This campus, spread over 13 kanals, consists of two separate academic blocks, the Junior and Girls High School, and Boys High School, with a covered area of 109,811 square feet for accommodating 3,300 students. The Junior and Girls High School accommodates Preschool (Nursery, Prep & Class I), Junior School (boys and girls from Classes II to V) and the girls of VI to X. The boys of Classes VI to X are housed in the Boys High School. These beautifully-designed edifices stand out as a leading centre of academic excellence in the northern part of Lahore.





Johar Town Campus

This campus, spread over 15 kanals, consists of two separate academic blocks ; the Junior & Girls High School and the Boys High School with a covered area of about 125,000 square feet, for the academic needs of 3,300 students. The level of classes and gender distribution follows the pattern of Kot Khawaja Saeed Campus. This state-of-the-art, alma mater stands aloof from the rest due to its highly conducive academic atmosphere and its march towards excellence.



Khayaban-e-Jinnah Campus

The Makkah Foundation has established another state-of-the-art campus, spread over 52 kanals, consisting of four academic blocks, an auditorium, a sports complex, and a swimming pool.

Presently the students of Nursery, Prep and Class I are studying in Preschool. Classes from II to IV for boys, and girls and Class V-boys are housed in the Junior School. Girls from Classes V to X and boys from Classes VI to X are accommodated in their respective high schools. This is a fourteen-section school with a capacity to accommodate over 6,000 students.

SYED MAUDUDI AUDITORIUM

In Khayaban-e-Jinnah Campus, a state-of-the-art auditorium with excellent acoustics has been constructed. It is superbly equipped with the best visual and interactive tools designed to facilitate smooth presentations and performances. It can comfortably accommodate over 400 participants.



SQUASH COURTS

The Punjab School is one of the few institutions in Pakistan that has introduced Squash at School level.

The Khayaban-e-Jinnah Campus houses two imposing Squash Courts with a covered area of 3756 square feet, elegantly furnished with AC, recommended illuminations & lockers facility. Its building material has been imported from Germany in order to meet the international standards.

A well-qualified and experienced coach trains the students.



MOVING FORWARD WITH TECHNOLOGY

To keep pace with the international developments in Education Technology and ensure an enabling environment towards digital pedagogical practices through highly trained teaching faculty, the integration of technology with education has a significant impact on the teaching-learning process. The emergence of technology-aided techniques and applications promises academic excellence for teacher-and-taught. Pedagogical techniques have been momentarily refined and augmented when thoughtfully blended with the conventional education setup. The Punjab School Management has strong reasons to believe that the thoughtful assimilation of interactive teaching and learning applications is one of the gateways to the 4th industrial revolution.

The E-Learning System of The Punjab School has been equipped with Interactive Online Google Classroom and online assessment. All the classes are well-loaded with subject-wise E-Learning Content including Teaching Notes, Video Lessons, and Assessment Forms. To get benefit from all available resources, the use of computers, laptops, and tablets, etc. are indispensable. The School Management envisions establishing an Innovation Centre aimed to set higher benchmarks for educational excellence.



Classrooms

The classrooms in all the campuses are purpose-built, spacious, well-lit and ventilated. These are furnished with necessary visual aids to ensure a superior academic environment. The furniture has been designed to ensure a comfortable and convenient posture according to the ages of the students. Each classroom ensures a perfect academic aura for maximum learning opportunities.

Interactive Boards

Modern education involves the use of new systems and techniques in teaching. A positive step has been taken by the school to introduce Interactive Boards for enhancing the skills of the students. These Interactive

Boards, which have been installed in every campus of The Punjab School, will make the process of learning interesting and effective. Presently, 18 Interactive Boards are in use and in future their number will be increased.

Multimedia Systems

The School has provided multimedia systems to all its campuses. Currently, 32 multimedia systems are in use. By incorporating multimedia in instruction, the teachers are capturing attention, engaging learners by providing effective instructional activities, explaining difficult concepts, and inspiring creativity.

MP3 Multimedia Speakers

MP3 Multimedia Speakers are used in

Preschool for the presentation of rhymes and conversational sentences. They are also used with Multimedia Systems. Their use is helping students comprehend and learn things more effectively. The school has provided 119 MP3 Multimedia Speakers to the schools concerned.

Science Laboratories

Keeping in view the vital role of Science Laboratories, separate laboratories for Physics, Chemistry and Biology have been established in the Boys and the Girls High Schools. These laboratories have all the necessary equipment and adequately fulfil the requirements of the students of elementary and secondary levels. The students of Junior School perform various educational activities in specially designed



Activity Rooms. A botanical garden has been developed at The Township Campus to carry out scientific studies, where the students study different types of plants in their natural environment.

Libraries

Extensive reading is an important skill which is mostly developed at the school level. In order to provide opportunities for extensive reading, the schools have established separate and independent libraries in all the blocks. These libraries are managed by qualified and experienced staff. A vast collection of books in Urdu and English, on various subjects, including encyclopedias, are available to develop the reading taste of the students. All classes have regular library periods so that the students may benefit from these storehouses of knowledge.

Health Care

The school takes utmost care of students' health and well-being. A full-time medical officer assisted by a qualified nurse attends to the health needs of the students during the school hours. Necessary arrangements for first aid and the treatment of minor injuries/ailments are readily available at the school campus. The school also arranges the visits of specialists once or twice in a session for the medical examination of students.

School Counselling Programme

The School has initiated Counselling and Guidance Programme with a view to providing support to the students in the areas of academics, social, emotional, career and personal development. This Programme provides equal opportunities to all the students to receive guidance and counselling.

Counselling services also empower teachers with necessary skills to address students' problems and to cope with their personal and social stressors. For effective management, collaboration is maintained with parents and teachers.

Head of Departments

Another important feature of The Punjab School is the appointment of well-versed and qualified, Head of Departments in the subjects of Maths, Urdu, English, Social Studies & Computer Sciences. Under their supervision, the departments concerned are achieving the highest possible standards of excellence.

Multipurpose Hall

Building plan of each school campus ensures the availability of a multipurpose hall for indoor games and routine functions.



School Transport

The School manages a fleet of twenty (20) school buses for providing transport facility to the students and the members of the teaching staff of Township, Kot Khawaja Saeed, Johar Town and Khayaban-e-Jinnah Campuses. These buses also provide conveyance facilities to the students during recreational trips. The parents willing to avail bus facility for their children are advised to contact the respective Transport Supervisor pertaining to the routes of the school buses.

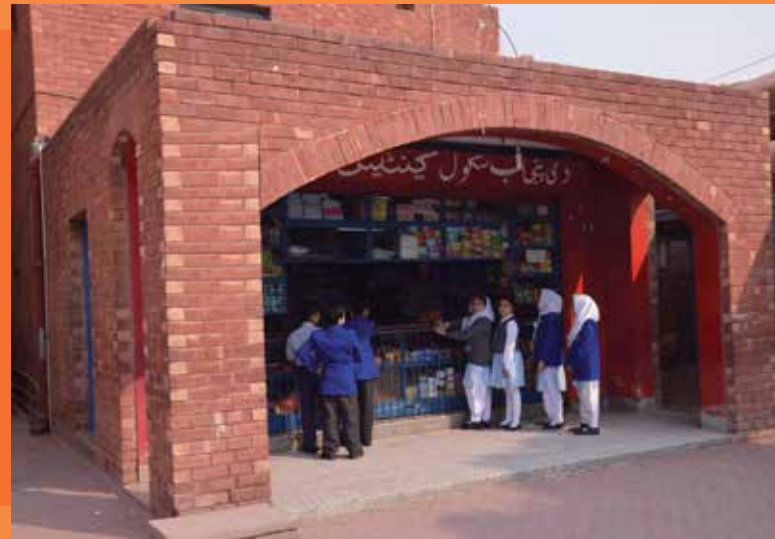


Shopping Areas

All the schools have separate shopping centres comprising bookshop, canteen and uniform shop to cater for the needs of the students. These centres supply them good quality items at comparatively cheaper rates. The eatables at the canteens are prepared hygienically. The quality and standard of food is monitored for health safety standards.

Standby Generators

The crisis of power supply has not only left a negative impact on routine commercial life and national production but the provision of civic facilities has also been affected badly. Intense heat and suffocation of summer is unbearable, as well as , students' concentration on academics during school hours cannot remain unaffected. So, generators have been installed in all the campuses to encounter the problem of power failure.



Curriculum and Affiliation

The designing of school curricula requires a conceptual foresight and imagination. Exhaustive evaluation and improvements are made year after year to keep the curriculum dynamic. All-out efforts are made to devise the most effective method for the implementation of the requirements of the curriculum. While selecting the Textbooks and designing Supplementary Reading Material, we generally keep in mind the “ student learning outcome” given in the Single National Curriculum (SNC) 2020. The Schools are affiliated with the respective Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education . The curriculum for different classes is discussed below:

Nursery and Prep

The first educational step that a child takes at an impressionable age of four is in Nursery and then on to Prep. Bearing in mind that the foundation of a child's personality is laid and two-thirds of his/her intellect develops at this age, we have created an environment and system of teaching which is entirely child-friendly. The students of these classes are housed in a separate block with their own work area, play-area and well-equipped activity room.

Steps are taken to achieve Holistic Development of students through the implementation of Early Childhood Care and Education Curriculum. Development is simultaneous and integrated and have been grouped into the following key learning areas:

- Physical Development
- Emotional Development
- Cognitive Development
- Health, Hygiene and Safety
- Social and Moral Development
- Language Development
- The World Around Us
- Creative Arts

Class I to Class V

The basic concepts that a child was introduced to, in the Preschool, take a more firm footing here and the syllabus becomes more broad-based. The young learner is gradually exposed to subjects like Urdu,

English, Mathematics, General Knowledge, Science and Social Studies besides the teaching of Islamiyat & Naazra Quran. Efforts are made to make the teaching more communicative and interactive to encourage students' participation.

Class VI to Class VIII

The curriculum, for Classes VI to VIII, is designed to develop the well-rounded personality of the students. It includes academics as well as a variety of co-curricular activities. The academic subjects include Urdu, English, Mathematics, Science (Physics, Chemistry and Biology), Social Studies, Computer Education, Islamiyat ,Arabic and Naazra Quran.

Class IX and Class X

Our schools are affiliated with the Board of Intermediate and Secondary Education Lahore. The curriculum prescribed by the Board is followed. We generally offer Science Group with Biology or Computer Science as an elective subject. However, the choice of Humanities Group is also available.

Teaching Faculty

The Teaching Faculty comprises 1115 professionally qualified, experienced and devoted teachers. The majority of the teachers possess Master’s Degree in their respective disciplines. Some of the teachers have MPhil degrees as well. Professional training, experience in teaching, mental alertness, self-confidence, commitment, general bearing and traits of a balanced personality are given due weight while recruiting the staff. Even for Nursery classes, the same criterion is observed and Montessori trained teachers have been employed keeping in view the mental level and the age groups of the students.

Staff Development Centre

The Punjab School has its own training centre for the professional development of the teachers. In-service training workshops are arranged throughout the year. These workshops are conducted not only by the professional trainers from different reputed institutions but also by the Master Trainers of The Punjab School.

Science,Technology,Engineering&Mathematics Education (STEM)

The STEM approach to education fosters creativity and divergent thinking along with fundamental disciplines. Project-based learning and problem-solving are essential for 21st century skills which will help learners excel in the future world of digital citizens. In our alma mater, students are introduced to STEM Education which is aligned with Academic setup focusing on inquiry-based assignments.

Computer Education

Elaborative and adequate arrangements have been made for its teaching at all school campuses. Periods have been allocated in the school weekly timetable for relative classes . There are 22, fully networked, computer laboratories with over 383 Core i3,i5,i7, Core 2DUO and Dual Core PC workstations. The schools continually upgrade and enhance their highly sophisticated and awe inspiring computing facilities. You can visit us at the website: www.thepunjabschool.edu.pk

Islamic Education

The curriculum includes Tajweed-ul-Quran, knowledge of fundamentals of Islam, learning of 'Namaz' with translation, 'Hifz' of selected Surahs and Ayahs from the Holy Quran, inculcation of social



virtues, the study of life of the Holy Prophet (ﷺ), and that of early caliphs and heroes of Islam. The school utilizes the services of qualified and dedicated teachers for Islamic education as well.

A large mosque has been built in the Township Campus where all members of the staff and the senior boys of the Boys High School offer their Zuhr prayer in congregation. The facility for offering Zuhr prayer is also ensured in other campuses where specific places have been reserved and maintained for this purpose. Separate rooms have been earmarked in each Girls School for offering prayers by the lady teachers and girl students.

Hifz-e-Quran Programme

The School launched the Hifz-e-Quran programme for boys in 2004. This is an optional programme offered presently in Township Campus only. This facility is offered to students of other campuses as well. The students after passing Class IV can opt for this stream. Preference is given to those students who secure at least 75% marks in the annual examination of Class IV with at least 90% marks in Quran as a subject. The duration of this programme is 3 years. After the completion of the Hifz, the students join the regular stream in Class VII.



So far 474 students have completed the Hifz, and presently 68 students are passing through the Hifz process.

Homework

We believe that homework is an extension of school activity and a crucial part of children's education. This helps them :

- develop independent study skills,
- acquire disciplined work attitudes and to meet deadlines,
- practise skills learnt at school,
- make rapid individual progress,
- prepare for lessons, and show that they have understood the lesson.

In the early classes, homework requires very little time to be completed but as children progress through the school, this span of time increases considerably. Active involvement and encouragement of students by parents along with guidance at home for completing homework is in the great interest of the child.

Students' Diary

Students' diary is a ready and convenient source for parents to interact with the teachers about the academic activities of their child. The students/teachers are supposed to record all that is taught in the classes each day along with the homework given to reinforce classroom learning. The record of the students' performance in class tests is also maintained in the diaries which is supposed to be signed by the parents regularly.

School Publications

The School prepares and prints, every year, its own workbooks/worksheets for different classes to bridge gaps within the curriculum for better utilization of learning time. Workbooks and student diaries are provided to the students at the start of each academic session. The school also publishes its magazine "The Futurist" every year and Newsletters that reflect the literary skills of the faculty and the students.

Sports and Physical Education

Sports and physical education develop self-confidence and serve to instil a sense of dignity in students. Physical training develops sportsmanship and enhances the confidence of even the shyest child. The schools have compulsory game periods with facilities for outdoor and indoor activities under the guidance and supervision of experienced sports coaches.

The Township Campus has a 320 feet long and 210 feet wide main playground for playing Hockey, Football and Cricket. Facilities for track events are also available. The other three campuses provide facilities for indoor games like Table Tennis and Badminton.

Our students are not only excelling academically but also making new records in swimming. Our swimmers put up a tremendously tough display of their sports mettle in Provincial and National Swimming Competitions and win laurels for their institution .

We are proud to mention that our old student Salman Akbar had been the captain of the National Hockey Team. Salman started playing the game at the Township Campus and was the captain of the school hockey team.

Swimming Pools

Township Campus and Khayaban-e-Jinnah Campus provide facility of swimming pools for students at a nominal fee. There are two separate fully-roofed swimming pools-one for the senior and the other for the junior students. These swimming pools, equipped with latest technology of filtration and heating arrangements, are providing year-round facility to our swimmers. Qualified and experienced ladies and gents swimming coaches train and supervise the boy and the girl students separately in swimming sessions.

Clubs and Societies

Co-curricular Pursuits

The students are encouraged to participate zealously in the weekly activities of these clubs and societies. These clubs and societies work dexterously in organizing the Annual Science, and Art and Craft Exhibitions and different events of the Activity Week. These clubs groom the students for various events at different forums.

The Punjab School has a brilliant track record of achievements in co-curricular activities. Recent years have been a long tale of victories of our students in Essay Writing, Quiz Competitions, Speech and Declamation Contests.

Scouting

The School arranges scouting activities to enhance the civic sense and spirit of social service in students. The students take keen interest in these activities and have won distinctions in scouting. A good number of our students have qualified for the Quaid-e-Azam Badge.

Our scouts attend Scouts Training Camps, during summer vacation, organized by Provincial Scout Organization at Ghora Gali.

Educational Trips

Ample opportunities are provided to the students to participate in a wide spectrum of educational visits to the places of historical, educational and cultural significance like Mangla Dam, Head Balloky, Head Marala, Lahore Fort, Shalimar Garden, Zoo, Lahore Museum, Science Museum, Planetarium and industrial set ups. These trips are planned to increase the students' knowledge of the outer environment and to develop a keen sense of observation and learning. These tours not only broaden their mental horizon but also augment their knowledge about the practical world. Such trips provide them with opportunities to see the world outside the school premises and come

in contact with the people at work from different professions and fields. They gain new experience, greater knowledge and exposure besides getting relaxed from the hackneyed routine.

Centralized Examination System

The School has its own centralized examination system which is managed by the Controller of Examination along with the team members.

Class Tests

Class tests in all subjects are conducted regularly on fortnightly basis. Being an important tool of formative assessment, these tests help teachers and parents pinpoint learning difficulties and adopt remedial measures accordingly. Marks obtained by the students in these periodic tests are regularly communicated to parents through the students' diaries.

Terminal Examinations

These examinations are held at the end of each term. In no case shall a student be allowed to appear for re-test/re-examination in any terminal examination for the subjects he/she missed. The class promotions are decided on the basis of students' performance in the examinations held at the end of final term of the academic session.

The schedule of these examinations is as under:

Class Nursery to Class IV

- Mid Year Examination - 2nd Week of September
- Annual Examination - Last Week of January

Class V to Class VIII

- 1st Term Examination - Last Week of May
- 2nd Term Examination - 1st Week of November
- Annual Examination - Last Week of January

Class IX & Class X

- Pre-vacation Examination - Last Week of May
- Post-vacation Examination - 1st Week of August
- Send-up Examination - 1st Week of November
- Mock Examination - Last Week of January

Send-up Examination

Comprehensiveness in proficiency definitely guarantees success in the toughest competitive environment. The format of tests introduced at our school aims at preparing the students for final examination. Send-up tests are, as such, held to assess the competence and suitability of students for appearing in the examinations conducted by the Board of Intermediate & Secondary Education for classes IX & X. If, in spite of all the best efforts, a student falls short of required minimum acceptable academic standard, it would be advisable for him/her to repeat the same class, instead of appearing in the Board Examination. The students failing in send-up examination will not be enrolled for these examinations.

Parents can also look through the date sheet , syllabi and result, of terminal /annual examination, of their child on school website.

General Rules

Class promotions will be decided by the headteachers at the end of the academic session. The general rules to regulate the conduct of annual examinations and class promotions are as under:

- A student with less than 80% attendance shall not be allowed to appear for the Annual Examination.
- Leave application for sickness during examinations must be supported by the medical certificate from a registered Medical Practitioner, duly endorsed by the School Medical Officer.
- A student who fails any subject, shall not be considered for class position, merit badge, reward, etc.
- A student who fails to appear for any terminal / annual examination for any reason, shall not be placed for position in the consolidated result.
- Internal grades shall be assessed on the basis of a student's overall performance in the send-up examination.
- The use of unfair means or cheating during the examinations shall result in cancellation of the paper, along with a strict disciplinary action. Recurrence of such an act will lead to expulsion from the school.
- A student who happens to miss the annual examination as a whole or has been absent in any paper for a genuine reason may be considered for promotion to the next class keeping in view his/her performance in the terminal examinations and class tests.
- Failures shall stand withdrawn from the school unless the Executive Director grants the permission to repeat the class. If a student fails for the second time in the same class, he/she shall be compulsorily withdrawn from the school.
- Answer sheets of terminal examinations duly checked/assessed may be handed over to the students. However, answer sheets of

the annual examination will be retained by the school for future reference.

- The parents who want the re-checking of their children's paper(s) can request for re-checking of the paper(s), on the prescribed form, within two weeks after the declaration of the result, after depositing a fee of Rs. 100/- per subject.

Promotion Criteria

The criteria of promotion for different classes are as under:

Nursery to Prep

The pass percentage for individual subjects shall be 60% with an aggregate of not less than 65%.

Class I to Class IV

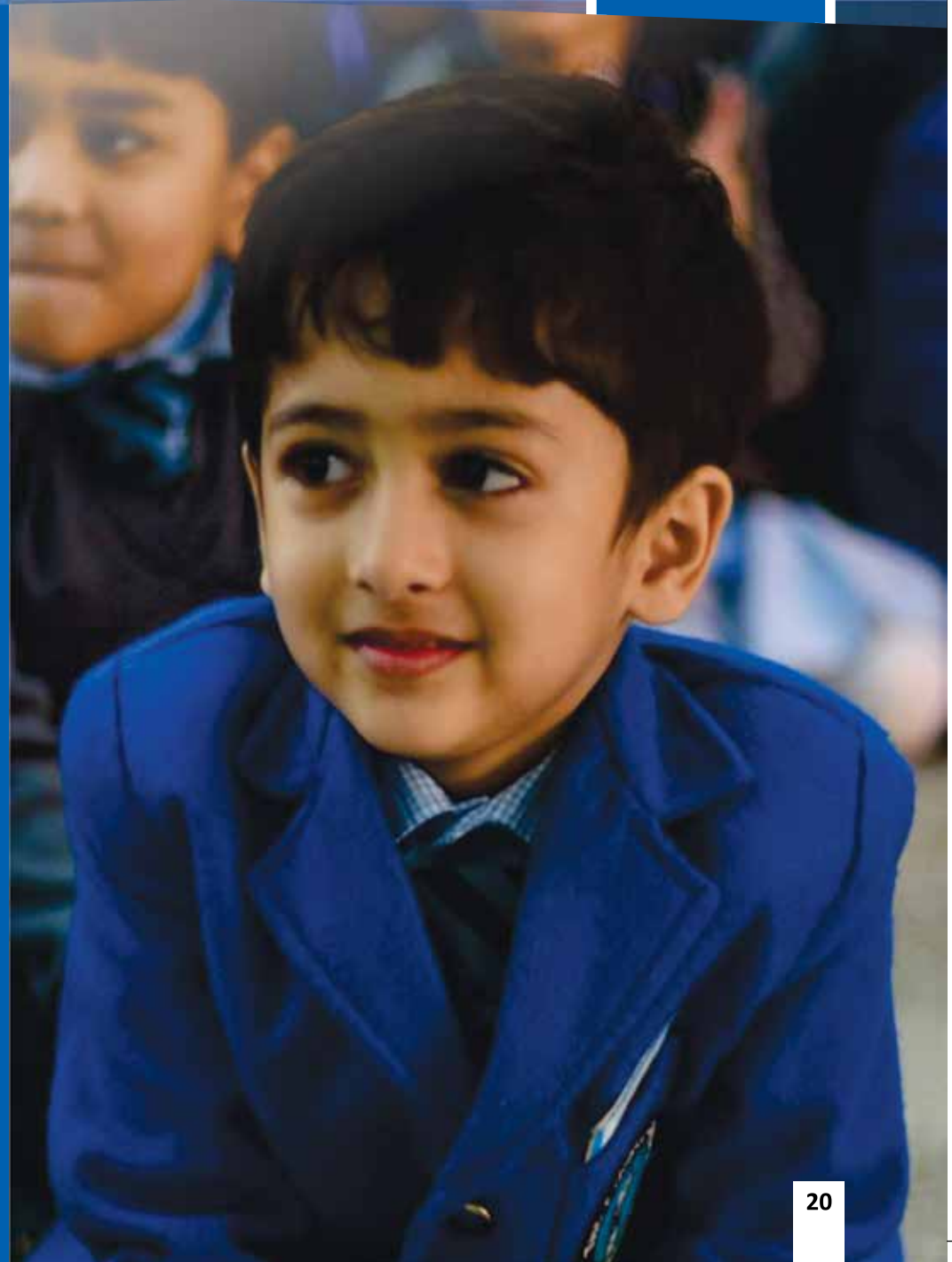
- A student securing a minimum of 45% in all the subjects shall be promoted to the next class.
- A student failing more than two subjects shall be detained in the same class. A student failing for the second time in the same class shall stand withdrawn.
- A student who has failed one subject and has maintained an aggregate of 45% or above shall be promoted.
- A student who has failed two subjects, has secured not less than 40% marks in these subjects, and has maintained an aggregate of 45% or above shall be promoted.

- A student who has failed two subjects, and secured less than 40% marks in failing subjects, shall be eligible for a re-test, to be conducted within 10 days after the declaration of the result. The student shall be promoted only if he/she secures at least 40% marks in each subject, he/she has appeared for the re-test, provided that aggregate marks are not less than 45%.

Class V to Class VIII

- A student securing 40% marks in each subject shall be promoted to the next class.
- A student failing more than two subjects shall be detained in the same class.
- A student who has failed one subject, has secured at least 30% marks in the failing subject and maintained an aggregate of 40% shall be promoted.
- A student who has failed two subjects, has secured at least 35% marks in these subjects and has maintained an aggregate of 40% shall be promoted.
- A student who has failed one subject securing less than 30% marks or the one failing in two subjects and obtaining less than 35% marks in failing subjects shall be eligible for a re-test to be conducted within 10 days after declaration of the result. The student shall be promoted only if he/she secures at least 35% marks in each subject, he / she has appeared for the re-test, provided that aggregate marks are not less than 40%.

The students may collect, duly assessed and marked, answer sheets of all examinations (excluding Annual Examination) after their marks have been entered in the school record.



Admission Criteria Nursery Class

The main induction to the school education is through Nursery Class. Registration for admission to Nursery Class opens in December. The admission test is held in January and the classes start in the 1st week of March. The admission to Nursery class is granted purely on the child's performance in scholastic aptitude test/interview. The child's age, on 1st March of the year of admission, should be between 4 and 5 years.

Prep and Class I

Admission is granted on the basis of merit determined by written tests held in the mid of February. The students are tested in English, Urdu and Mathematics. The minimum age for the child at the time of admission should be 5 years for Prep & 6 years for Class I.

Class II to Class IX

Admissions to these classes are granted subject to the availability of seats in the respective classes. The admission test for these classes is usually held in Mid of February. There is a written test in the subjects of English, Urdu, and Mathematics for admission to Classes II-V and for admission to Classes VI-VIII, the candidates shall be tested in Science as well. Besides written test, the candidates are also evaluated for proficiency in Naazra Quran. All these admissions are merit based.

Normally admission to Class IX is not offered. However, the admissions can be granted on the basis of candidates' performance in the Annual Examination of the Class VIII held in the first two weeks of February, subject to the availability of seats.

Admission Procedure

The candidate for admission has got to be registered with the school. The admission procedure starts as soon as the parents fill in the Registration Form which is available at the Fee Section. The school prospectus and syllabus for the admission test shall be provided by the Fee Section at the time of registration. Registration for admission does not, in any way, ensure admission to a particular class. The school reserves the right to reject applications without assigning any reason. The students qualifying for the written tests and interview are issued admission forms by the heads of respective schools.

A student who wants to migrate from another school must furnish a transfer certificate, last progress report and a receipt of school fee duly paid in the previous school at the time of admission. In case of fresh admission, a form ب issued by the NADRA must be attached.

Fee Structure

Necessary information pertaining to the fee structure and fee rules can be obtained from the Fee Section of the campus concerned. The school dues at the time of admission of a student shall be deposited in the Fee Section of the campus concerned. Thereafter, the dues shall be deposited in the designated branches of the banks. A minimum raise of 5% in the school dues shall be made every year.

School Dues

- School dues are received on quarterly basis. However, the facility of payment of dues on monthly basis is also available on written request.
- Fee challan are handed over to the students by the class teachers one week before the due date of payment. In case a student fails to receive the fee challan for any reason, like absence from school etc. , the parents shall be responsible to collect the fee challan from the Fee Section.
- School dues shall be deposited only in the designated branches of the banks.
- If the dues are not paid by the due date, the same shall have to be deposited along with late fee as per rules printed on the Fee Challan.
- In case the dues are not deposited within the stipulated time, the name of the student shall be struck off the school roll without any prior notice and he/she will not be allowed to attend the classes until re-admitted after the clearance of dues and the payment of re-admission fee.
- In case of request from a parent/guardian for withdrawal of a student, full fee for the quarter during which he/she is withdrawn, shall have to be paid. The School Leaving Certificate shall not be issued unless his/her account is settled in full. The fee once paid is neither refundable nor transferable.
- In case a student seeking admission has not attended any recognized registered institution since the beginning of the financial quarter, the school dues (fee and other subscriptions) shall be charged from the beginning of the academic year.

School Uniform

Uniform is a distinctive dress pattern reflecting tidy identity inside and outside the school. The school uniform is compulsory in the school premises. The prescribed patterns /designs of the uniforms are available at all the uniform shops of the schools. The use of tie pins, chains, rings or any other piece of jewellery is not allowed. The staff and school administration shall not be responsible for any loss or theft of jewellery items unauthorizedly brought to school.

School Hours

The school remains open five days a week: Monday to Friday. Keeping in view the weather conditions, the school timings are notified from time to time.

The Parents / Guardians are advised to drop their children / wards five minutes before the school starts and collect them within forty-five minutes after the pack-up time. The school shall, in no way, be responsible for the safety and security of the children if they are not picked up in time. A fine of Rs. 100/-per student shall be charged in case the parents/guardians do not collect their children /wards within the specified time limit.

Attendance, Absence and Fine Rules

- Regular attendance is an important requirement for achieving excellence in results, as such students are required to be punctual and regular in all school functions.
- A written application for leave must be submitted well in advance. In case of illness and other unforeseen circumstances, the parents/ guardians should inform the headteacher in writing as soon as possible.
- The name of a student who is absent, without leave, for 10 consecutive days in 30 calendar days or a total of 15 days in an academic term shall be struck off the roll. On readmission, a fee of Rs.2000/-shall be charged in addition to the absence fine at the rate of Rs. 30/-per day.
- A student whose name has been struck off for absence without leave and who is a habitual truant or undisciplined may not be re-admitted to the school.
- A minimum attendance of 80% of the total working days is

required during the academic year, falling short of which the student shall not be allowed to take the annual examination that year.

- Every student must be present on the re-opening day after each vacation.
- It is advisable to ensure that a student is not disturbed during examination days and not asked to attend social functions like marriage etc.
- A medical certificate from a government hospital or a registered medical practitioner, duly endorsed by the School Medical Officer, must accompany a leave application for the leave of illness:
 - for 7 days or more;
 - immediately before or after the summer vacation, winter and spring breaks and during class tests or examination days.
- Merit certificates are awarded to the students at the end of the academic session, who have more than 95% attendance during the academic session.
- In order to inculcate the habit of regularity and discourage absence from the school, the following fines are imposed:

○ For the late arrival	- Rs. 10.00 per day
○ For absence of whole day	- Rs. 20.00 per day
○ For absence from school immediately preceding or succeeding vacation / holidays	- Rs. 50.00 per day
○ For absence from Class Test	- Rs. 50.00 per test
○ For absence from Term Examination	- Rs. 100.00 per day
○ For absence from Post Vacation Examination/Send-up/Mock Examination	- Rs. 200.00 per day

For Students

- The students are required to be in proper uniform at all times during school hours. However, if a student cannot wear the proper uniform, the parents must send in a note stating the reason to this effect and the probable date when the student would return to the complete outfit.
- All students must wear their school ID Cards at all times.
- The students coming late may not be allowed to enter the class without the headteacher's permission.
- The students are required to observe class discipline rules and routines.
- The students are expected to concentrate on their work without disturbing others in the classroom.
- The students must show respect to all the members of the teaching staff, support staff and their fellow students at all the times, therefore:
 - rudeness, use of vile, vulgar, or indecent language, or immoral behaviour shall not be tolerated,
 - roughness or fighting in the classrooms, at any school function / celebration, or on the school grounds shall not be condoned, and
 - derogatory remarks or the use of obscene or foul gesticulation shall not be allowed.
- Chewing of gum is strictly prohibited in school premises.
- Damaging or mishandling the articles of school property e.g. desks, chairs, equipment, machines, library books and walls, etc. , or stealing private or school property shall be considered to be a misconduct and a serious violation of the school rules.
- The possession of weapons or firearms is a serious offence. The students who are in possession of such weapons in school or posing threats with weapons shall be straight away expelled from the school.
- Any other matter that the students' Ethics and Discipline Committee finds objectionable may result in the issuance of yellow / red card, imposition of a fine and/or suspension/expulsion from the school, depending on the severity of the offence.
- The use or possession of narcotics/ illegal drugs or drug related items is strictly forbidden in school. The violation of this rule shall entail disciplinary action which may result in expulsion from the school.
- The students should not carry any matchboxes, combustible material, knives, or other potentially dangerous instruments to school.
- The students who threaten to harm school employees/ other students or school property, verbally or in writing shall be expelled from school.
- All the students are expected to show the highest standards of moral values all the time. Cheating in any part of the test or examination shall disentitle the claimant from any award in that subject. A repeated offence may result in expulsion from school.
- No jewellery is to be worn except a decent wrist watch, and make-up of any kind is not to be used. Nails are to be kept trimmed.
- No student is allowed to bring a mobile phone. In case of violation, a fine of Rs. 1000/- shall be charged.
- The use of motorcycle without a valid driving licence is prohibited.
- In the case of contagious illness, the child is not allowed to attend school without a fitness certificate from a registered medical practitioner.

Parents Teachers Consultation

Coordination between parents and teachers is imperative for better academic achievements of students. Effective parents-teachers interaction can take place only in an atmosphere of mutual trust, singularity of purpose and uniform sense of direction. Parents and the teachers are the two main stakeholders working simultaneously for the physical, mental and spiritual development of children. When children are confronted with academic and emotional problems, such consultation is valuable in diagnosing the context in which they occur and also helpful in formulating the plans of action for resolving such issues. Children are more likely to respond positively when they see their parents and teachers working in close cooperation. These meetings are held on the last Saturday of every month between 9 am to 12 noon. The parents are expected to attend regularly the parents-teachers meetings.



Change of Address/Contact Numbers

It is the responsibility of parents/guardians to ensure that the school has their correct address and up-to-date phone numbers for connectivity (home, office/business or emergency) at all times. The school must be informed about the change, if any, immediately in writing.

Communicable / Serious Diseases

The parents must inform the school about any communicable or other serious disease. i.e. measles, asthma or diabetes contracted by their children etc. If the school has a reason to believe that child has a communicable disease, the parents/guardian shall be asked to take the child home. In any case, the infected child shall not attend the school until a clearance medical certificate is furnished. If any student, due to any disease, is on medication which he/she has to take during the school time, the parents must send in written information regarding the use of prescribed medicine.

Parental Cooperation

- The parents are required to send their children to school on time; students coming late may not be allowed to attend the class and would be sent back home at parents' risk.
- The parents are required to look into their children's school diary every day and ensure that the lessons and assigned homework are completed.
- Observations / remarks made in the diary are acknowledged and signed by the parents regularly.

- If the parents feel that their child is not making the desired progress, they must discuss it with the Headteacher, the class teacher and the subject teacher.
- The parents are requested not to criticize and find faults with the school or a teacher in the presence of the student. Such criticism may cause the student to lose respect for the teacher and the school.
- The parents are not allowed to meet the children or their teachers during school hours without prior permission of the headteacher.
- The parents or other visitors are not allowed to see the teachers in their respective classrooms.
- The parents are expected to attend regularly the parents- teachers meetings and other school activities when they are invited.
- The parents are required to inform the school, through the class teacher, of any change of postal address and telephone numbers.
- The parents are requested not to:
 - o send a sick child to the school with medicines, to be taken during school hours, except medicines required in an emergency like an inhaler for asthmatic students.
 - o take the child from school during school hours except for any unforeseen circumstance for which written request shall be made to the headteacher.
 - o visit the headteacher for unscheduled meetings.
 - o approach the class teachers or the subject teachers to teach their children privately as our teachers are not permitted to give private tuition.

Inter-Campus Transfer of Students

The students studying in different branches of the chain may avail themselves of the facility of inter-campus transfer on the basis of kinship or on providing proof of change of their residence nearest to the campus applied for, subject to availability of seats in the campus at the other end. Request for change of campus shall be entertained immediately after the announcement of the annual examination results, and during the summer vacation.

No such transfers can be claimed as of right.

Withdrawal

The parents who want to withdraw their children from the school are to collect the Withdrawal Pro forma from the Fee Section and submit the same in the Fee Section after duly filling the particulars. The parents are required to submit the school cards or any other identity document along with the withdrawal application.

The school-leaving certificate is normally issued within two days of the receipt of withdrawal application.

Change of Routines and Policies

The rules and regulations, mentioned herein, may be changed as per decisions of the school management. The changes shall, however, be intimated by the class teacher through school diaries or a circular.

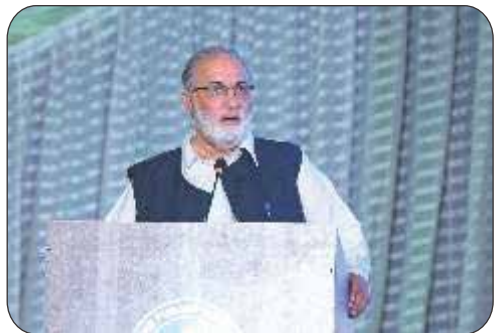
